Trustees Report

The trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31st August 2020.

Constitution, Structure and Governance

The Charity was established 2nd February 1965 by Charity Commission scheme and subsequent scheme of 10th February 1983. It is operated under a constitution confirmed in March 2019.

The purpose of the charity is to provide buildings, space and facilities to the village of Ousden. The charity is managed by a committee of trustees consisting of a minimum of 4 persons. Trustee meetings are held at least 3 times a year and require a quorum of 3 persons to vote. An Annual General meeting is held in October of each year.

Review of the year.

Before the Village Hall had to be closed in March due to the Covid-19 pandemic the Bowls Club and Yoga functioned as usual giving the hall a steady income. There had been a small number of bookings for private hire, polling station and Parish Council meetings and the Ousden and Lidgate Cricket Club had used both the Playing Fields and the Hall facilities during the 2019 season.

There were three successful money raising events including the Popup Café in September, Race Night in November, the Ceilidh in February and more were planned.

As a result of an increase in the precept the Parish Council had underwritten the expenses giving the Charity £2,800. The Charity also receives recycling money.

Donations were received from Waitrose, The Community Fund and Suffolk Community Fund to help the Popup café. Miscellaneous donations come mainly from organised ramblers who use the facilities.

With lock down the hall was closed from March until the end of August. Income ceased but expenditure continued. Insurance, fire extinguisher servicing, waste disposal and grass cutting still needed to be paid for. There was some saving of electricity cost as no one was using the Hall. Costs associated with the New build including the planning application, a land contamination survey, a site survey and a bat survey were incurred.

Fortunately the Charity qualified for a Government Covid-19 Grant of £10.000. As can be seen a surplus of £9,478 was generated but were it not for the Covid-19 Grant the Charity would have made a deficit of £522.

The trustees are grateful to the Parish council and the people of the village for their continued generosity. The annual accounts, prepared on an income and expenditure basis are attached.
