Planning Seminar

Calls for engine idling to be punished with £20 fines – Parking enforcement officers in West Suffolk are set to begin talking to drivers over engine idling from next week – but calls have been made for fines to be allowed

HGV noise and pollution on Bury St Edmunds estate 'unacceptable' - Suffolk County Council has been urged to take action addressing long-running problems of noise and pollution from lorries on Moreton Hall in Bury St Edmunds

Decision is delayed on 200 new homes for edge of Exning village – A decision on plans for more than 200 homes and a nursery near Newmarket has been pushed back so that issues can be ironed out.

New 500k pipeline will bring water to Suffolk and Essex – Works on the new 500k pipeline that is being built to carry water from wetter parts of north Lincolnshire to drier areas in Suffolk and Essex is set to step up a gear over the next few months as new planning applications for the scheme are submitted. West Suffolk Council is mentioned as it and other authorities are due to consider applications in their areas.
